<p><b><i>Diversity in the Creative Industries (Leader)</i></b></p>	<p><b><u>Objectives</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To stimulate the employability of young creative talents from an ethnically-diverse background and to create a more inclusive representation of our society within the creative industries.</li> <li>• To improve access to professional networks, improve career-oriented capacities, competences and opportunities for young talents who want to pursue a career in creative industries.</li> <li>• To target young people, aged 18 – 30, who have had higher educational training in the creative industries or who are at an early stage of their careers.</li> <li>• To develop collaboration between EU organisations as part of the ERASMUS+ Strategic Partnerships Programme.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Activities - Results</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two-year collaboration between Swideas and the organisations Capture22 (Netherlands) and Euroaccion (Spain).</li> <li>• Mapping diversity in the creative industries in each partner country and addressing the lack of diversity among the workforce.</li> <li>• Sharing information, resources and experiences across the industry (including Best Practices from the 2-year-project).</li> <li>• Articulating the business case and illustrating ways that employers can make a real-difference.</li> <li>• Delivering a set of priorities on the diversity agenda for the creative industry in each country to focus on.</li> <li>• Improving the mobility of youth in Europe through international internships between the three countries.</li> <li>• Creating an online platform through which young creative talents can communicate with each other and professionals in the creative industries.</li> <li>• Coordinating local events to enhance the knowledge about diversity in the creative industries and to improve the skills and capacities of the youths.</li> </ul> <p>Creating long term engagement, knowledge and collaboration between different stakeholders.</p>

<p><b><i>Absence of War is not Peace Training (Participant)</i></b></p>	<p><b><u>Objectives</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To support activities that contribute to living together in dignity and dialogue in conflict-affected areas and communities and beyond them, and at promoting young people’s and youth NGOs’ roles in peace-building.</li> <li>• To promote the conception that peace is an active state that has to be practiced to be maintained.</li> <li>• To share best practices and resources for establishing follow-up projects for further peace-building.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Activities-Results</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participants developed their knowledge, skills and attitudes towards peace education, conflict transformation and conflict management.</li> <li>• Participants gained practical tools and techniques to use in future peace-building projects.</li> <li>• The training course in Sebútal, Portugal gathered 24 youth workers, youth leaders and people working with youth from Portugal, Armenia, Italy, Georgia, Poland, Moldova, Egypt, Luxembourg, Sweden, Russia, Spain and Turkey, and was financed by EU via Erasmus+.</li> <li>• The project was implemented in cooperation with World Independent Youth Union (Armenia), CESIE (Italy), Robert Schuman Foundation (Georgia), MMS - Stowarzyszenie Moje Marzenia Spelniaja Sie (Poland), A.O. Generatia Tinerilor (Moldovia), Intercontinental Global Center (Egypt), Foreign Students of Luxembourg (Luxembourg), Scientific Advisory Center «Consciousness» - Falcogroup (Russia), Asociacion Cultural Sende (Spain), and Karakutu Dernegi (Turkey).</li> </ul>

<p><b><i>Eco Entrepreneurship Knowledge Resource Hub (Eco-Hub) (Partner)</i></b></p>	<p><b><u>Objectives</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To develop knowledge on eco-entrepreneurship as a way of addressing climate change and youth unemployment.</li> <li>• To target young people, aged 18 – 30, who have a green idea or are interested in developing one.</li> <li>• To build the capacity of young people on how to turn their ideas for environmental solutions into a successful sustainable start-up.</li> <li>• To provide tools to support youth in the development of eco-entrepreneurial ideas, projects or enterprises.</li> <li>• Creation of an Eco-Entrepreneurship Incubator in Humblebaek, Denmark.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Activities- Results</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two-year collaboration between SwIdeas and the organisations Crossing Borders (Denmark) and Kalevan Lukio (Finland).</li> <li>• Mapping sustainable and eco enterprises in each partner country to collect the existing knowledge in the field of Eco-entrepreneurship.</li> <li>• Sharing information, resources and experiences across the industry (including Best Practices from the 2-year-project).</li> <li>• Encouraging youth to come up with innovative businesses ideas which are environmentally responsible</li> <li>• Coordinating local events to enhance the knowledge about eco-entrepreneurship, how to create a green start-up and to improve the skills and capacities of young people.</li> <li>• Creation of tools to support young people in the process of setting up an enterprise and to solve critical problems that can occur in the establishment and running of a social enterprise.</li> </ul>

<p><b><i>Innovation Lab Training (Participant)</i></b></p>	<p><b><u>Objectives</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Civil society is now facing challenges that require new ways of thinking. The training aimed to encourage civil society actors and youth workers to experiment with brave and innovative ideas to tackle increasingly complex and difficult social issues.</li> <li>• To empower voluntary and professional youth workers to realise their ideas and start social innovation projects.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Activities- Results</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participants had the opportunity to formulate and develop project ideas for social innovation with participants from across the EU.</li> <li>• Enhanced participant’s capacity to develop social projects.</li> <li>• The participants will have the opportunity to implement these ideas as projects in their own organisations.</li> <li>• There were 24 participants from 11 different countries (Belgium, Croatia, Cyprus, Estonia, Hungary, Italy, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, and Turkey) got the opportunity to work together in a six day innovation lab in Szeged, Hungary funded by the Erasmus+.</li> </ul>
<p><b><i>Youth to Youth - deliberations and sharing of experiences on the current Mediterranean Refugee and Migrant Crisis: its challenges, impacts and opportunities (Partner)</i></b></p>	<p><b><u>Objectives</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To engage youth in discussions on the reception and inclusion of refugees and migrants in their societies.</li> <li>• To facilitate the exchange of perceptions on the reception of refugees and migrants across the EuroMed region.</li> <li>• To empower and facilitate youth’s engagement with local and regional authorities on integration in their societies.</li> <li>• To include youth voices in public debate</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Activities-Results</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 8-month collaboration between Swideas and Crossing Borders (Denmark), The Lebanese Foundation for Permanent Civil Peace (Lebanon) and People Demand Change (Turkey).</li> <li>• A 5-day training for 16 youths to become ambassadors of Diversity and Change for a more tolerant Euro-Med through trainings in tools and methods of youth mobilization, youth facilitation, storytelling, public communication, conflict resolution and advocacy.</li> <li>• Two workshops held by youths to disseminate tools learnt at the training among their peers.</li> <li>• Engagement of youth with local and regional authorities on inclusion of refugees and migrants in their communities.</li> </ul>
